

Celebrity Cruises' strong relationship with the Galapagos community began in 2004 with the inaugural sailing of *Celebrity Xpedition*. Partnerships for sustainable tourism include training and education programs benefiting the environment, agricultural, fishing, educational and health programs.

- To date, Celebrity Cruises guests have planted more than 40,000 native Scalescia trees in partnership with the Galapagos National Park
- Excursions are led by Galápagos National Park naturalists, who inspire guests to immerse themselves in the ecosystem
- Locals benefit from a safe, clean processing plant to prep, store and sell their catch due to the creation of the fishing co-op. Guests enjoy the locally sourced "daily catch" onboard
- The World Wildlife Fund's Russell E. Train Education for Nature Program (EFN) provides financial support to local conservation leaders addressing area challenges
- Greenhouses have been built and support provided for farmers associations through organic agriculture initiatives, resulting in the creation of the hybrid "Galapagos tomato"
- Families now enjoy three highly-anticipated soccer pitches contributed by Celebrity Cruises
